Once Popular Trends Losing Favor Among Homeowners

Housing trends come and go. Just think of those avocadocolored stoves from the 1970s or the formica bedroom sets of the 1980s. The woodburning fireplace was a must-have home accessory in the early 1990s, but now it is losing ground to pellet stoves and greener options. Here are a few other housing trends that are going out of style and making room for newer designs.



spring greening Manageable Means to Going Green Around the House

Instead of using harmful chemical cleaners when cleaning around the house this spring, choose green cleaning supplies that don't release harmful chemicals or toxins into the air.

Spring is a popular time to repaint rooms in the house. Homeowners with painting on their to-do list this spring cleaning season should choose noor low-VOC (volatile organic compound) paints.

Chances are. after a long winter homeowners are well aware of which rooms were warm and which might have had drafts. Visit those colder rooms and plug any air leaks around the house. This will result in a lower heating bill next winter and could save substantial amounts of energy. For homeowners with attics, checking the attic for air infiltration should be done each and every year.



Cost

Many are aware of the sticker price of 3D televisions, which is still considerably high because of the relative infancy of the technology. However, it's the cost of the accessories that might be of greater concern. Much like in a movie theater, home 3D viewers will need 3D glasses to watch their television sets. While many manufacturers promise two sets of glasses with the purchase of a 3D television, others still only provide one pair. But consumers who enjoy hosting viewing parties or having friends over for the big game will need to ensure there are enough sets of glasses so their quests can enjoy the show as well. With glasses going for more than \$100 a pair, that can make a 3D television a considerable expense, one that extends beyond the initial sticker price.

Programming



While 3D enthusiasts love to hear that 3D programming is on the rise, the current slate of 3D programming is not nearly as extensive as it is for more traditional programming. This might only be a minor consideration, however, as 3D programming figures to grow in the years to come. Sports fans should also know that ESPN currently broadcasts in 3D, which is enough for many sports fans to dive right in.

Caming

Gamers might find 3D television worth it regardless of the cost. 3D gaming brings gamers seemingly right into the game, offering gamers entry into the virtual reality they've been yearning for as games have grown more and more advanced. The 3D format figures to be integrated into gaming systems sooner rather than later, with some systems already promising the format is just around the corner.



Viewing Problems



Not all viewers can enjoy 3D technology. For example, viewers with astigmatism have found depth perception difficult with 3D televisions. Eye strain might also prove problematic, particularly for those people who must wear glasses when watching television. For that group, it can be difficult or bothersome to watch 3D programming with eyeglasses and the necessary 3D glasses.







Cooking Surface for the AVID FOODIE



Marble is often prized for its appearance and durability. ore and more people are taking cooking and baking into their own hands and equipping their kitchens with the necessities for churning out quality meals.

Possibly spurred on by the growing number of DIY cooking shows on television, individuals are experimenting with lavish cakes, cookies and other culinary treats. They want their kitchens to offer the amenities that will enable them to whip up delicious food items.

A lot of the prep work that goes into cooking and baking takes place on countertops in the kitchen. There are many durable counter surfaces, but not all of them are suitable for preparing foods.

Marble counters are one of the coveted surfaces for prepping foods and many baked goods. Although marble is also very attractive in the kitchen, it has many properties that make it conducive to the kitchen environment.

Marble is one of the most durable stones available. The price of marble clearly illustrates its enduring nature. Ancient civilizations turned to marble to make buildings and statues because of its durability. Most of these structures are still in good condition today.

Countertops of marble are heatresistant and will not burn or catch fire. But it's best to place a hot plate between the marble and the pan or pot to protect the finish that may be on the countertop.

Due to the strength of marble, countertops made from this material are also highly resistant to scratches, cracks, and breakage. However, the sealant on the marble could become scratched or damaged and require stripping. Talk with a countertop installer about the use of the marble in the kitchen to determine the best ways to protect the stone.

Marble is often cool to the touch, making it an ideal surface to roll out pastry doughs and sugar pastes for baking. Many fine chefs also rely on a marble rolling pin to avoid sticking of doughs due to heating.

Because marble can be porous, it's suggested to seal it properly so it won't discolor or harbor bacteria.





Landscaping can add value to a home. The right tools make most jobs easier.

pring has sprung for most areas of the country and the average homeowner's "honey-do" list likely has its share of outdoor landscaping tasks that need to be tackled. The right tools can make easier work of outdoor chores.

A report from the Associated Landscape Contractors of America titled "Economic Benefits of Landscape" states that landscaping can add as much as 14 percent to the resale value of a building and speed its sale by as much as 6 weeks. Homeowners looking to sell their home or just improve its market value will want to consider landscaping a viable investment. A March 2003 article in Smart Money noted that homeowners can expect to earn back 150 percent or more of their landscape investment through the value it brings to a property.

Whatever the landscaping project, the right tools will make any task that much easier. There are certain items every homeowner should have in his or her gardening arsenal.

• Various garden hoes: Hoes can be used for breaking up soil, weeding, cultivating, aerating, and many other purposes.

• **Spading fork:** Another tool that loosens soil with straight tines that dig through dense soil.

• **Soil cultivator:** A multi-pronged tool that breaks up clods of soil and grass to provide easier planting.

• **Cloves:** Avoid blisters and insect bites with durable gloves that protect the hands.

• **Branch pruner:** A durable branch trimmer/pruner can cut through thick or thin branches and keep landscape items tidy. Pruning also helps promote growth of many flowers and shrubs.

• Various garden hoes: A

multipurpose shovel can dig through dirt, gravel and the like.

•**Rakc:** A steel-pronged rake will till soil and spread out mulch and other organic matter in planting beds. A flexible rake is good for collecting leaves and thatch.

• **Edger:** Available as manual or gas powered, an edger gives planting beds and the edges of lawns a clean look.

• **String trimmer:** Weeds can easily be trimmed with a string trimmer that can work around bushes and other hard-to-reach areas.

• Wheelbarrow:

Transporting gravel, rocks, mulch, shrubbery, and many other garden essentials is made easier with the help of a wheelbarrow or a garden cart.



• **Hoses:** Drip irrigation hoses can deliver water right to plants' roots where they need it most. A regular nozzle-powered hose can be used for cleaning and misting plants and surrounding hardscapes.

ast spring, the horticulture committee of the Shenandoah Herb Society started an herb teaching garden at Sunflower Cottage, on Reliance Road in Middletown, in hopes of teaching others about herbs. Now that the garden is flourishing, committee members hope to offer monthly herb walks, said the committee's chairwoman, Phoebe Reeve of Winchester.

On a recent spring morning, she and two other members were preparing the garden for the season, weeding and beginning to harvest early herbs. "We educated each other about the actual horticultural aspect of it" when first planning out the garden, Reeve said of the five-member committee. Other

"We have all the perks and benefits of being in the national group," she said, and though the membership meeting has already passed for this year, she hopes to encourage others to join. One local benefit of belonging to the Herb Society of America is receiving



• Place area rugs or mats at the doorways entering the home. This way sand, dirt and other debris can be wiped off at the entryway and not carried onto the wood flooring where it can cause abrasions over time.

- Pay careful attention to which types of shoes are worn on the floors. High heels or cleats can damage the wood. Removing shoes prior to walking on the floor is a safer bet.
- Choose the right type of cleaner for the floor. Do not assume

just because a particular cleaner is adequate for wood cabinetry or furniture that it is also fine for wood flooring. Check the label.

• Use area rugs and carpet runners on areas of the floor that tend to be high-traffic areas. This will prevent these areas from being worn down unevenly from other areas of the floor.

• Do not allow water or other liquids to stand on the floor for a long duration. This can cause degradation of the wood and staining.

• Use felt or plastic protectors on the "feet" of dining room chairs or other furniture to prevent against scuffing or scratches. Wood flooring can be an expensive addition to any home, but one that is sought after for its aesthetic appeal. To ensure a floor remains in good condition over the long haul, take action to protect hardwood floors as soon as possible.

Planning and Preparation

Before choosing a design, look carefully at your surface and space. Some designs are useful for disguising flaws in a floor. For other designs you may need to patch and smooth flawed surfaces first.

moisture, tape a 12" x 12" piece of 3 mil plastic or aluminum foil tightly on all four edges to the surface. Remove it after 24 hours. If the floor side of the plastic or foil is damp, allow additional drying and then repeat the test. It is very important not to have trapped moisture in the concrete; it is the number one reason why epoxy and latex concrete floor paints fail.

Protecting the Pattern



What's the deal with all these **STINKBUGS?**

There are few things that unite crop producers, horticulturalists, business owners and homeowners like the Halyomorpha halys.

The brown marmorated stink bug is an equal opportunity pest - annoying homeowners grown weary of finding the bugs crawling across their floors and walls and also wreaking economic havoc in the agricultural community. Stink bugs indigenous to the United States have been around for decades. but the brown marmorated variety is relatively new. Native to Asia. it was first discovered in the United States in Allenton, Pa., in 2001 having arrived, it is suspected, in shipping containers. They were discovered in Virginia in 2005 and have been found in as many as 30 states.

The stink bug, which gets its name from the putrid odor it releases when squashed or stressed, doesn't bite, sting or pose a health risk to humans, but is an aggravation to homeowners and a financial disaster to growers. The infestation is so bad that agricultural researchers are working feverishly to develop pest management guidelines for growers. A discussion by 10th led District U.S. Rep.


Frank Wolf was held April 18 in Loudoun County and focused on ways to control the infestation and minimize economic damage in the region. The stink bug "is the most invasive pest introduction fruit growers have seen in a long, long time," said Dr. Christopher Bergh, associate professor of entomology with Virginia Tech's Winchester Agricultural Research and Extension Center in Frederick County and a member of the Brown Marmorated Stink Bug Working Group, a collaborative team of researchers, stakeholders, regulators and private industry representatives from around the country. Studying this pest "is going to dominate everything we do for a while," he said.

Last year, the stink bug population "reached epidemic proportions," Bergh said. The Northern Shenandoah Valley is a year or two behind West Virginia and Maryland in population size but still, some local peach growers experienced 100 percent loss of their crops last year and some apple growers lost half their fruit production, he said.

The brown mamorated stink bug is a grayish brown, shield-backed bug only about three-quarters of an inch long. White bands color its antennae and legs and black and white spots are found on the abdomen. Adults fly, which has aided their migration. The bug feeds on many foods, including tree fruits, seed pods and vegetables. In Virginia, apples and peaches have been hardest hit and high densities have been found in soybeans

and corn. The bug feeds by piercing fruits and vegetables, leaving discolored and sunken areas. Damage is not always evident at harvest and has appeared on the fruit in cold storage.

"I don't think we fully understand the full range of hosts it feeds on," Bergh said.



The stink bug has no natural predators in the United States and, so far, pesticides haven't proven effective. "It's my understanding that most experts don't think we can spray our way out of this one," said Bobby Clark, Shenandoah County extension agent.

"We don't have a lot of hard data from the field on the effectiveness of one program verses another," Bergh said, but laboratory evaluations are proving helpful. Last month, Berg and his associates placed traps at four local farms and will monitor those throughout this growing season. A doctoral research associate at the lab has received a grant to determine when apple and peach crops are most vulnerable and will conduct a complex study throughout the summer as well.

Tracy Leskey, a research entomologist with the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Appalachian Fruit Research Station in Kearneysville, W.Va., and a founder of the stink bug working group, has screened more than 50 chemical compounds and has provided that data to extension agents and crop consultants as they brace for the onslaught this growing season. "As this insect rapidly established in the region, we all responded," she said.

The U.S. Apple Association estimates the damage in mid-Atlantic states last year at \$37 million. The four biggest apple-producing states in the region -Virginia, West Virginia, Maryland and Pennsylvania - were down in production 18 percent.

high food prices. "They're not picky, they feed on whatever." Grove said of the bug. With grain and bean prices higher than normal, any damage to a crop will be a significant blow to farmers, Grove said. Cordell Watt, president of the Frederick County Fruit Grower's Association and owner of **Timber Ridge** Fruit Farm in Gore. first noticed the bugs four years ago "but last year they became a real problem," he said. Watt. a

third-generation grower, thinks all damage estimates are low.

Keys to Fixing Wet Basements

wet basement is something thousands of homeowners contend with but none look forward to fixing. Water entering the basement can be an expensive repair job, and it seems like few homes are impervious to water infiltration.

Water can enter a basement or crawlspace in a number of ways, seeping through the floor if the surrounding ground is constantly saturated or entering through cracks in the foundation walls. Leaky basement windows could cause water to enter, while improperly draining downspouts and gutters may cause water to pool around the home's foundation and enter the home.

A wet basement can decrease a home's value and potential damage what's in the home. Standing water in a basement can also pose health hazards, such as mold and mildew

growth, and can prove a breeding ground for insects that like moist conditions.

There are a number of techniques used to combat basement water issues. A waterproofing company can help homeowners ascertain what method will be best for the type of water issue they have.

• Find the source of water. Sometimes water remediation requires minimal effort or simple solutions. It may be a grading issue on the property or landscaping that is causing water to pool around the home's foundation. Fixing these issues can alleviate water in the basement.

• Create a barrier. A dampness or water issue may be remediated by creating a barrier between the water and the inside of the home. Waterproofing paints and sealants can be applied to both the outside and inside walls of a basement. However, waterproofing application on the outside of the home may cause disruption to landscaping and the need for excavation to reach foundation walls. Inside application is easier, but eventually the product may need to be reapplied if water pressure causes the sealant to blister or peel off. A plastic vapor barrier can be installed in crawlspaces that have vented concrete or dirt floors. This will help to protect against moisture in the space.

• Install drains. Various drainage systems are designed to help with basement water issues. Depending on the drain, it may be installed at the perimeter of the basement interior or on the exterior of the home. The drains are designed to capture water from the ground and direct it far away from the foundation. Drains can gradually become clogged with sediment and dirt and may need to be cleaned or replaced. Newer innovations in basement drainage systems that alleviate clogging issues are available through reputable businesses.

• Use a sump pump. For other water issues, a sump pump can help gather groundwater in a sump pit and pump it out and away from the home. It's a good idea to have a backup source of power for the sump pump because if the power goes out, the sump pump will be rendered useless.

Water is the No. 1 enemy of basements and crawlspaces. It behooves the homeowner to take fast action to correct water issues in the lowest part of the home to ensure comfort and safety.

Basement Versatility



Basement built with pre-cast insulated Xi wall panels provides added living space for homeowners.

These days every inch of space in the home counts.

So, when considering building a new home, it makes sense to consider building both "up and down" to maximize your living space.

"Basements are like 'found space' in the home because they're so versatile that you can make a wellbuilt basement an extension of your living areas," says Jim Costello, president of Superior Walls. "To maximize basement space, it's critical to construct the area below ground with a pre-cast insulated foundation system that's energyefficient and damp free. This way the basement area is a welcoming, active part of the home rather than a 'dump all' storage area."

Costello recommends constructing a basement with Xi wall panels. Each precast foundation panel is constructed with a concrete face shell, backed by 21/2-inches of DOW Styrofoam insulation. Steel reinforced concrete walls create a permanent barrier against sidewall water penetration, making the basement system dampproof.

"These foundation systems are very popular with homeowners because you can create door and window openings in them to access natural light." says Costello. Lead Paint Hazards and Older Windows

f your home was built before 1978 and you still have the original windows, it's time to seriously consider replacing your windows — especially if you have young children or a pregnant person living in the home.

According to the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), the routine opening and closing of windows in homes built prior to 1978 can disturb lead-based paint around the windows, causing paint dust and chips to be released into the air. Nevin relates that the most common problem with lead in paint is not that a child is eating paint chips — it's that the child may be exposed every day to unseen contaminated lead dust particles that have settled in household dust. The lead-contaminated dust is often connected with the operation of the window.

According to Nevin, one of the most important long-term investments a homeowner can make for the overall safety of a family is to replace older windows, using the EPA-approved lead safe renovation guidelines. "If you live in a home built before 1978, and you have single-pane windows, replace them now," says Nevin. "This is one of the only ways to reduce lead risks for your family. Make sure to use only a contractor that is certified in lead-safe work practices and strongly consider the use of ENERGY STAR® qualified windows, like the vinyl replacement windows offered by Simonton Windows. 

all eight meetings and club programs, \$50 of which goes to the national organization.

"It's a real good group of people," she said. Members are not required to have experience in gardening, she said. They need only have an interest.

"They don't know much, but they want to learn," she said of some members.

Other members, though, have built their careers around gardening, and some even are Master Gardeners.

"The horticultural society has been going for two years," said Reeve, who has a master's degree in herbal horticulture and degrees in therapeutic herbalism and aromatherapy. She has trained at the National Herb Garden in Washington.

Committee member Sondra Johnson, of Warren County, has been an herbalist for more than 30 years. She began working with skin issues and making plant products when her son developed psoriasis about 10 years ago.

The herbs didn't cure his psoriasis, since topical solutions don't solve the problem, she said, "But you can take them to look and feel better."

Johnson used borage from the garden last year to make what Reeve calls a "fabulous borage balm with lovely oils." The society sells the borage balm at \$5 for a 1-ounce tin and \$8 for a 2-ounce tin.

"And we intend this year to do more projects like that," Reeve said.

A pesto event is also in the works.

"We grow a ton of basil here at Sunflower Cottage," Clifton said. "It's an extra party we're planning," where they will make pesto from fresh basil "and eat and drink and play and take it home with them," she said.

The garden, meanwhile, is divided into four sections, the learning garden offers mints and thyme, culinary herbs, healing herbs and scented herbs.

Reeve pointed out herbs like chamomile, whose white flowers are used in making tea, and sage, "which we all know and love, especially around the holidays." Sage, chives and rosemary are some herbs she indicated as being culinary herbs.

The uses of rosemary are something "we of European extraction know well," she said of the herb that spread across Europe and is used with eggs, meat, candies, cakes and pies. It's used very potently and therapeutically, she said, and formerly was used with salt and pepper to cure meats so they would keep longer.

"It affects the hypothalamus," she said, explaining that rosemary sends a message to the brain to halt sweating and also can be used as an alternative to caffeine.

Horseradish, the designated herb of the year for 2011, is an ancient plant used around the Middle East, she said. One of the five sacred herbs of Passover, it's a bitter herb, whose root is mixed with cream and vinegar and used with meat like beef, she said.

"Rue is a very highly therapeutic plant ... It's actually tonic to the female reproductive system," Reeve said, but she cautions never to touch it with bare hands. "It actually causes the cells of your skin to become sensitive to sun." A 32-page book the Shenandoah Herb Society published this year could help those interested in learning about the uses of herbs. Simply called "Herbs," the 32-page book is \$7.50 at Sunflower Cottage or online at the society's website, www.sunflowercottage.net/ shenandoah_herb_society.php.

The society currently has about 25 members, but they always hope for more.

"It's an opportunity to meet people who love to garden, who love to cook, who love that the plants are healing for us, who love to craft with them." Reeve said.

The plastic interlayer is also puncture-resistant, frustrating potential intruders.

TIP #6 — Looking to protect your home from the sun's harmful ultraviolet rays? Request Low E glass in your windows to help reduce the fading of carpet, furniture and window treatments.

hen a person comes to a certain age and the children move out and on with their own lives, a home may become too big for its occupants. At this point, residents may feel it's time to downsize to a smaller home.

Downsizing can be exciting and challenging at the same time. Going through and packing belongings can be a trip down memory lane. But chances are a smaller space will mean that a person will have to part with a number of his belongings collected over time.

"With other pests, I feel we have a fighting chance. We don't see how we can tackle this thing," he said. The local research lab is using Watt's farm to test the new trap that might possibly provide a glimpse into how to control the bug. "They're trying to accumulate data to see if we can pick up anything" that would help, Watt said. "They're kinda baffled. There are so many unknowns."

Watt likened the pest to the 17-year locust only "this is like fighting them every year for six months. This is a tough beast to tackle."

Researchers in Newark, Del., are studying the effectiveness of four species of wasps from Asia, but more information is needed before they will be approved in the United States, Leskey said. Releasing the wasps to combat the stink bug could disrupt other systems.

Desperate homeowners have turned to extension agents and pest management experts for help. Grove said his office was "inundated" last year with calls from homeowners. "We had folks who wouldn't even go outside" last year. "There's not a lot they can do because they feed on everything and nest everywhere."

Jeff Fortune of Pest Management Services Inc. in Winchester expects the calls from frantic homeowners to pick up once warm weather sets in. He recalls one customer last year who had so many bugs in her house that her wall resembled mold.

"In the last year, (stink bugs) have been Biblical in proportion," he said. But there's only so much that can be done. Pest management companies can spray chemical compounds but it appears they must apply it directly to the bug to be effective. "They are flying insects so you can never completely stop them," Fortune said.

Homes in wooded areas have it worst, according to Harriet Harris, owner of Best Exterminating Services in Front Royal. Barbara Gimber, who lives surrounded by trees in the High Knob Subdivision east of Front Royal, turned to Harris for help when the bug first showed up about four years ago. "They have consistently been getting worse year after year. They are driving me out of my house," Gimber said. Gimber learned quickly not to squash the bug and bought a hand-held vacuum to best deal with the nuisance once they get inside her home. Chemical compounds sprayed outside minimize the population some, Gimber said. "I love the spring months, to open windows and doors but that's not possible anymore."

Adult stink bugs begin to emerge from their winter shelter in the spring, laying eggs in May. Those nymphs emerge and become adults and lay eggs in July. The second generation appears in late August. As summer turns to fall, the adults begin seeking shelter again inside homes and other structures and begin the cycle again the following spring.

Homeowners are advised to seal up as many crevices around windows, doors and other openings as possible. While the infestation of 2011 may end up worse than last year, people can take heart in knowing that researchers are working hard on solutions. "There's going to be a tremendous account of effort and creative energy going forward," Bergh said. "After this season, we'll know more."
